3. The purposes and legal basis for the processing of your personal data

We process your personal data for the following purposes:

The purpose of the evaluation the residents experience of living in a sustainable building.

The legal basis for our processing of your personal data follows from:

The processing is necessary for the sake of a legitimate interest, which is not surpassed by the interests or rights of the data subject.

Legitimate interests, where pursued with the processing

As mentioned above, our processing of your personal data ((in part)) is based on the balancing rule of Article 6(1)(f) of the Data Protection Regulation. The legitimate interests justifying the processing are supporting the sustainable development of our clients' future building portfolio.

4. Categories of personal data

We process the following categories of personal data about you:

- Background data: gender, age, marital status and people in your household.
- Opinion regarding: indoor climate, choice of materials, housing quality and the sustainable identity of the house

5. Recipients or categories of recipients

We disclose or entrust your personal data to the following recipients:

6. Transfer to recipients in third countries, including international organizations

We will not transfer your personal data to recipients outside the EU and EEA.

7. Where your personal data comes from

Personal interviews and a survey.



8. Storing your personal data

We store your personal data from interviews for 6 months and anonymous questionnaire data in a database for 5 years on AARTs server with restricted access for relevant employees in AART

9. Automatic decisions, including profiling

We do not use automatic decisions, including profiling.

10. The right to withdraw consent

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. You can do this by contacting us on the contact information shown above in point 1.

If you choose to withdraw your consent, it does not affect the legality of our processing of your personal data on the basis of your previously announced consent and up to the time of withdrawal. Therefore, if you withdraw your consent, it will only take effect from that point on.

11. Your rights

Under the Data Protection Regulation, you have several rights in relation to our processing of information about you.

If you wish to exercise your rights, please contact us.

Right to view information (right of access)

You have the right to access the information we process about you, as well as a number of additional information.

Right of reply (correction)

You have the right to have incorrect information about yourself corrected.

Right to delete

In special cases, you have the right to have information about you deleted before the time of our general deletion occurs.

Right to restriction of treatment

In some cases, you have the right to have the processing of your personal data restricted. In future, if you have the right to have the processing restricted, we may only process the data – other than storage – with your consent, or for the purpose of establishing, asserting, or defending legal claims, or to protect a person or important public interest.

Right of objection

In some cases, you have the right to object to our or lawful processing of your personal data. You may also object to the processing of your information for direct marketing.

Right to transmit information (data portability)

In some cases, you have the right to receive your personal data in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format and to have that personal data transferred from one data controller to another without hindrance.
